

Ordinance of Bachelor of Medicine & Bachelor of Surgery**1. Scope:**

- This ordinance shall apply to the program leading to Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of surgery degree: MBBS.
- The various clauses of this ordinance of the program are subject to provisions and circulars notified by Medical Council of India.
- Any change / revision/ modification as well resolution passed / circular issued by the Medical Council India, shall be incorporated as it is by the University in their compliance with immediate effect.

2. Eligibility for Admission:

- A candidate seeking admission to the MBBS program should have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Biotechnology and English individually in the Intermediate examination of U P Board or 10+2 level equivalent examination from any Board/ University recognized / approved by Bareilly International University and obtained a minimum of 50% marks taken together in physics, chemistry and Biology/ Biotechnology; which shall be subject to guidelines and directives of Medical Council of India, State/ Center government issued from time to time.
- In respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes or other backward Classes, the marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Biology/ Biotechnology taken together in qualifying examination be 40% instead of 50% as above.
- A candidate shall complete the age of 17 years on or before 31st December of the year of admission to MBBS course.

3. Admission:

- Admission to MBBS 1st year shall be made through counseling based on merit of National eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) conducted under over all superintended, direction and control of Medical Council of India and in accordance of State/ Center government directives issued time to time.
- Admission to program shall be made only in 1st year and last date for admission shall be 30th September of the admission year.

4. Program Duration:

The Program of MBBS is four and a half years, followed by compulsory rotatory internship of one year

5. Annual Intake

The number of students shall be admitted as approved by the executive council of the university subject to maximum seat sanctioned by the Medical Council of India.

6. Medium of Instruction

The medium of instruction for all subjects of study and examination shall be English.

7. Attendance:

- a. Each student is normally required to attend all the lectures and practical of every subject as also the curricular and co-curricular activities.
- b. A student must have minimum 75% attendance in theory, practical, seminar, group discussion, tutorials, demonstrations, hospital postings, bed side clinical postings, etc. of each subject for appearing in the examination.
- c. In special circumstances, short fall in attendance can be condoned on case's merit to the extent of 5% by the Principal. If the short fall is more than 5%, the Principal may recommend on case's merit to the Vice Chancellor for condonation. The order of Vice Chancellor shall be final.
- d. In case a student, falls short of attendance, he/ she will be allowed to sit only after making up of short attendance before the supplementary examination. However, he/ she will be considered to have cleared the professional examination for all purposes in the first attempt.
- e. If a student for any reason is admitted to the program beyond the closing date, the prescribed attendance norms i.e. 75%, shall be applicable to him/ her to appear in the 1st professional examination and the attendance percentage shall be calculated out of the total classes conducted for the batch.

8. Organization of the Program:

- a. Each academic year is divided in to two terms and the duration of 4½ years excluding the period of internship is divided into 3 phases and each academic year in to two semesters.

- b. The MBBS program is divided in to three phases –

Phase 1: Pre – Clinic - 1st Professional – spread over 1st to 2nd Semester

Phase 2: Para – Clinical - 2nd Professional - spread over 3rd to 5th Semester.

Phase 3: Clinical - 3rd Professional - spread over 6 to 9th semesters

- c. Afterward, one year compulsory rotatory Internship and shall mean integrated clinical duty per day.

9. Syllabi:

The syllabi of the program shall contain subject wise content details as prescribed by Medical Council of India duly approved by Board of study and academic council shall be published separately and shall incorporate modifications/ changes as and when notified by MCI.


10. Program Curriculum:


Phase-I-Pre-clinical: Subjects covered -Anatomy, Physiology, Bio-chemistry and concurrently introduction to Community Medicine.

Phase-II – Para-clinical: Subjects covered –Forensic Medicine, Pathology, Pharmacology, Microbiology, concurrently with Community Medicines and introduction to clinical subjects; Clinical posting of 2hrs every day in wards and exposure to OPD's

Phase-III - In this phase didactic lectures, demonstrations, seminars, group discussions etc. of clinical subjects continues along with 3 hours clinical postings.

The course delivery in each academic year shall be carried out in accordance with minimum hours assigned to each subject (lectures, demonstrations, seminars, group discussions etc.)





- Theoretical: The question paper setting will be prepared according to subject wise objectives in line with guidelines and directives of medical council of India.
- Student evaluation during University examination will be carried out on objective basis.
- A student's performance will be evaluated through University examinations held at the end of each professional phase and internal assessment during each professional.

- **Viva/ oral:** is to evaluate skill in interpretation of investigative data, x-rays, identification of specimens, ECG, etc. and approach /handling of emergencies.
- **Practical –Lab / Clinical:** shall take into account common diseases which the student is likely to come in contact in practice. Rare cases/obscure syndromes, long cases shall not be put for final examination.
- c. The internal assessment of theory and practical shall be assigned at the end of each professional term, based on cumulative of semester wise performance in test, assignments and day to day assessment including preparation for seminars, clinical case discussions etc.
- d. In the semester students assessment shall be based on his/ her performance in the following attributes with division of marks as under-

- e. Student shall be allowed to improve their score by reappearing in the test during the semester. A student remained absent is also permitted in such re-tests
 - He / she shall have to make application for makeup/ re-test along with fee of Rs.1500/- for each subject to the Principal within 10 days of announcing of test result.
 - Re-test shall be conducted only on Sundays.
 - The score of this test shall replace the earlier scores.
- f. The University examination and internal assessment shall be the part of the evaluation scheme.

12. Examinations:

- a. Phase wise examination will be conducted as -
1st Professional examination --- at the end of 2nd semester
2nd Professional examination -- at the end of 5th semester
3rd Professional part I examination -at the end of 7th semester
3rd Professional part II examination- at the end of 9th semester
- b. In a academic year two university examination shall be conducted The main examination shall be held at the end of the each phase and the other examination -supplementary/ auxiliary examination will be conducted within six months of main examination.

13. Qualifying Standards:

- a. A student is required to pass in university examination and internal assessment separately.
- b. Minimum pass marks for theory and practical university examination shall be 50% and minimum passing marks for internal assessment shall be 35%.
- c. The marks obtained in the University examination and in the internal assessment of the subject shall be added to compute subject percentage.

14. Promotional Rules:

- a. A student fails in internal assessment shall not be eligible to appear in University examinations.
- b. A student who fails in the theory or practical examination, shall have to re-appear in the subject as a whole. However the students internals awards shall remain unchanged.
- c. A student shall be allowed to appear in the 2nd professional examination only after he / she has passed all the subjects of 1st professional.
- d. A student shall be allowed to appear in the 3rd professional part I examination only after he / she has passed all the subjects of 2nd professional.
- e. A student shall be allowed to appear in final examination only when he/ she has passed/ cleared all the subject of 3rd Phase Part I.

15. Grace Marks:

A student can be awarded 'Grace Marks' not exceeding a maximum 5 marks either in theory or practical or both in accordance to MCI guidelines. However, the grace marks shall not be part of the grand total.

16. Results:

- a. The examination result of a student shall be declared separately for each examination which will indicate the status of his performance in the respective professional.
- b. Final result for declaring division and award of degree shall be prepared on the basis of cumulative performance of student in each professional.



c. A student result of professional shall be updated based on outcome of his/ her appearing in an examination.

17. Award of Division:

- The division to a student shall be awarded based on his / her 'FINAL RESULT'.
- A student will be said to have ' Passed with Honors' if he/ she obtains 75% or more marks in final result, provided he/ she has passed all examinations in first attempt and without invoking any grace marks.

18. Merit List:

The merit list to award the rank shall be prepared on the basis of aggregate marks of final result . However those students who have passed all examination in first attempt without invoking any grace marks shall be eligible for award of Rank.

19. Award of degree:

The student shall be eligible for award of MBBS degree on successful completion of prescribed course of study and have been declared pass in final result.

20. Power to Amend the Ordinance

The 'Academic Council' shall have the powers to relax, amend any or all the provisions of the Ordinances, subject to the approval of the 'Executive Council' of the University. However amendment shall not be in contravention of guidelines and directives of MCI.
