

1. Scope

This ordinance shall apply to the program leading to Master in Public Health (MPH).

2. Admission Criteria

Candidates should have bachelor's degrees in any discipline, which includes Science/ Commerce/ Nursing/ Allied Health Science/ Veterinary Science/ Art/ Law/ Pharmacy, etc. from any recognized Indian university with minimum marks- 50% for open and 45% for SC, and ST categories.

3. Course Duration

MPH is postgraduate course in Public Health. The course is of 2 years duration. The two-year course is further divided into 4 semesters of six months each.

4. Annual Intake

The annual intake to 1st year of the program shall be 30 or as approved by the executive council of the university.

5. Medium of Instruction


English shall be the medium of instruction for all the subjects of study and for the examinations of the Master in Public Health (MPH) course.

6. Attendance

- a) A candidate is required to obtain minimum 75% attendance in all theory subjects so as to be eligible to appear in the University Examination.
- b) Further relaxation of attendance up to 5% to the student can be given by the Head of Institution/ Principal on genuine/ compassionate grounds with prior permission under special circumstances.
- c) No student will be allowed to appear in the university examination if he/she does not satisfy the overall average attendance requirements of clauses- a) and b).
- d) The names of the students, who are not eligible to appear in the university examinations, are to be intimated to the Controller of Examination and the concerned students before the commencement of exam.

7. Organization of the Program


- a) There shall be minimum 17 weeks devoted for academic activities, excluding 3 weeks for examination and their preparations.
- b) The academic activities shall be carried for minimum 30 hrs per week.
- c) The course delivery in each semester shall be carried out in accordance with minimum hours assigned to each theory subject.













7. Internship Report

Every student of MPH shall be required to undergo internship in a hospital. A candidate shall submit his/her internship report (on the basis of his/her residency in hospital) in a format as prescribed for his/her categories. Since it is mandatory for every student to undertake on-the-job internship in a hospital, the internship duration will be of 12 hours per week. The student after the completion of internship will submit a report to the college/ Institute, which will form part of semester examination. However, the internship report must be submitted within two months of commencement of the next semester academic activities.

8. Research Project

- a) Every student should have to work on a project, the subject of the project work will be assigned by their respective project guides and HOD/ Coordinator.
- b) The candidate shall be required to submit two copies of his/her project report, type-written. The last date receipt of project report in the Office of the Head/ Coordinator of the department shall be one month before the commencement of the Examination provided that in exceptional cases the Head/ Coordinator of the department may extend the last date of receipt of the project report.
- c) In Fourth semester, the candidate will have to submit a Research Report on a Topic to be assigned by the department of MPH under the supervision of a core faculty member of the department.
- d) The project report shall be of 100 marks for report and viva presentation. The project report shall be evaluated jointly by the external and internal examiners at the time of viva-voce.

9. Examination Criteria


A student must obtain 50% marks in practical and theory examinations to pass the concerned subject(s)/ professional. 75% and above marks in a subject will indicate distinction in the subject.

Classification of Results

- Distinction 75% marks in a single attempt and above in the aggregate.
- 1ST Division 60% marks in a single attempt and above in the aggregate.
- 2nd Division 50% marks in a single attempt and above but less than 60% in the aggregate.

10. Curriculum

The 2 year curriculum has been divided into 4 semesters and shall include lectures, tutorials, practicals, seminars, projects, etc. in addition to hospital training etc. as defined in the scheme. The curriculum will also include such other curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities as may be prescribed by the University from time to time.

12. Schedule of Examination

There shall be an end term University Examination at the end of each semester.

13. Internal Assessment

It shall be based on evaluation of periodic tests, assignments, presentations, etc. The Periodic tests will be conducted during each semester. However, minimum of two internal tests will be conducted. Moreover, the Internal assessment shall be submitted to the University before the commencement of the University Examinations.

14. Promotional Rules

A student shall be declared pass in a semester when he/she is pass in all the theory subjects. A student shall not be promoted to next year if he/she fails to clear maximum three subjects, provided he/she has cleared all the theory subjects of previous years and result shall be declared as 'Promoted with back paper/s'.

A student shall appear in the forthcoming odd/ even semester examinations to clear back paper(s) only. A student shall be eligible to undertake internship only when he/she has cleared all the subjects. A student, who fails in the theory examination, shall have to re-appear in the University examination. The students may improve their internal assessment by appearing for 'Improvement for Sessional Examination.'

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15. Supplementary Examinations

The University will conduct one Main Examination and one Supplementary Examination in each semester. Supplementary Examinations will be held along with forthcoming odd/even semester examinations, as applicable.

16. Grace Marks

A student can be awarded 'Grace Marks' not exceeding a maximum 5 marks in theory, which can be shared by not more than two subjects. The grace marks shall not be added to the aggregate marks.

17. Declaration of Result

The result of a candidate shall be declared by the University on the basis of the performance of Theory and Viva-Voce examination. In an individual subject, the minimum pass marks (including internal assessment) shall be 50%. The marks obtained in the University Examination and in the Internal Assessment of the subject shall be added to compute subject percentage.

18. Award of Rank

The merit list shall be drawn on the basis of commutation result of all semesters. On the basis of final result, the top ten candidates in each branch shall be awarded rank according to their merit, provided they pass all examinations in first attempt.

19. Award of Degree

The student shall be eligible for the award of MPH degree on successful completion of prescribed course of study and has been declared pass in final result.

20. Scrutiny and Re-evaluation

Scrutiny shall be allowed only in theory papers, subject to maximum two subjects.


21. Cancellation of Admission

The admission of a student at any stage of study shall be cancelled if:

- a) He/she is not found qualified as per norms or guidelines or the eligibility criteria prescribed by the University.
- b) He/she is found involved in creating indiscipline in the Institution/ College or in the University.
- c) He /she is involved in an act of ragging.

22. Power to Amend the Ordinance

The 'Academic Council' shall have the power to relax, amend any or all the provisions of the Ordinance, subject to the approval of the 'Executive Council' of the University.



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Eligibility Criteria for Examiners

(2 Years Postgraduate Course- MPH)

1. Examiner – Paper-setter (External)

A person holding MPH/ MD/ MHA/ MBA/ M.Sc. (Biological Science) or any other professional degree in the related subject with minimum three years teaching the subject/s, whether in service, practicing or retired at the time of appointment as Paper-setter.

2. Examiner – Answer Script Evaluation (External)

A person holding MPH/ MD/ MHA/ MBA/ M.Sc. (Biological Science) or any other professional degree in the allied subject with minimum one year teaching the subject/s, whether in service, practicing or retired, at the time of appointment as Examiner.

3. Examiner – Project Report Evaluation (External)

A person holding MPH/ MD/ MHA/ MBA/ M.Sc. (Biological Science) or any other professional degree in the allied subject with minimum five year teaching or practicing professional, weather in service or retired at the time of appointment as Examiner.

4. Examiner – Paper-setter (Internal)


A person holding MPH/ MD/ MHA/ MBA/ M.Sc. (Biological Science) or any other professional degree in the related subject with minimum three years teaching the subject/s, whether in service, practicing or retired at the time of appointment as Paper-setter.

5. Examiner – Answer Script Evaluation (Internal)

A person holding MPH/ MD/ MHA/ MBA/ M.Sc. (Biological Science) or any other professional degree in the allied subject and teaching the subject/s, whether in service, practicing or retired, at the time of appointment as Examiner.

6. Examiner – Project Report Evaluation (Internal)

A person holding MPH/ MD/ MHA/ MBA/ M.Sc. (Biological Science) or any other professional degree in the allied subject and teaching or practicing professional, weather in service or retired at the time of appointment as Examiner.





Scheme for Internal Assessment

1. Internal Assessment marks shall be shown separately in the Marks Sheet issued by the University and these marks shall be added to the semester examination marks for determining the division of the student.
2. 30% of the maximum marks in each paper in postgraduate courses shall be assigned for Internal Assessment and the remaining 70% marks for the semester University Examination; the time duration and other modalities of the semester Examination with respect to this 70% component shall remain as per existing schemes of examination for various undergraduate courses.
3. There shall be 5% weightage assigned to the First Internal Examination and 5% weightage assigned to the Second Internal Examination to be conducted by the college, for all subjects in Pass course.
4. Each student shall be assessed on the basis of written assignments/tutorials as well as on the basis of project reports/ term papers/ seminars. There shall be 10% weightage for such written assignments/ project reports/ presentations/ term papers/ seminars. Each student shall be given at least one written assignment per unit in each paper, subject to a maximum of 10 written assignments per semester for each paper.
5. There shall be 10% weightage for regularity in attending lectures and tutorials, and the credit for regularity in each paper shall be on the basis of the percentage of attendance.

[Medical certificates shall be excluded while calculating credit towards marks to be awarded for regularity, though such certificates shall continue to be taken into account for the purpose of calculating eligibility to appear for examinations as per the existing provisions of Ordinance]



Ordinance of Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine & Surgery
Effective from Session 2021-22 Batch onward

1. Scope:

- a. This ordinance shall apply to the program leading to Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and surgery degree: BAMS.
- b. The various clauses of this ordinance of the program are subject to provisions and circulars notified by National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM).
- c. Any change / revision/ modification as well resolution passed / circular issued by the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), shall be incorporated as it is by the University in their compliance with immediate effect.

2. Eligibility for Admission:

- a. The candidate shall have passed 10+2 or its equivalent examination from any recognised Board with Physics, Chemistry, Biology and have obtained minimum of fifty percent marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology in the case of general category and forty percent marks in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes which shall be subject to guidelines and directives of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), State/ Centre government issued from time to time.
- b. A candidate shall have to complete the age of 17 years on or before 31st December of the year of admission to BAMS course.

3. Admission:

- a. Admission to BAMS 1st year shall be made through counselling based on merit of National eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) at the under-graduate level, in each academic year and shall be conducted by an authority designated by the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine.
- b. Admission to program shall be made only in 1st year and last date for admission shall be as notified by National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) and or Ministry of Ayush.

4. Program Duration:

- The Program of BAMS is four and a half academic years, followed by one-year compulsory rotatory internship.
- A student shall not be entitled to graduate after completion of 10 years of joining of the programme.

5. Annual Intake

- The number of students shall be admitted as approved by the executive council of the university subject to maximum seat sanctioned by the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) and or Ministry of Ayush.

6. Medium of Instruction

- The medium of instruction for the programme shall be Sanskrit or Hindi or any recognised regional language or English.

7. Attendance:

- a. Each student is normally required to attend all the lectures and practical of every subject and the curricular and co-curricular activities.
- b. Each student shall be required to maintain minimum seventy-five percent attendance in each subject in theory (i.e., lecture hours) practical and clinicals (i.e., non-lecture hours) separately for appearing in examination.

- c. Attendance is to be marked in cumulative numbering fashion.
- d. In case presence is to be marked as 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6.....so on;
- e. In case of absence, it must be marked as 'A' ; Example: P PPP A P P AA P P P.... may be marked as (1, 2, 3, 4, A, 5, 6, A, A, 7, 8, 9...).
- f. Avoid strictly marking 'P' for presence.
- g. Separate register for Theory and practical/clinical/non-lecture activities are to be maintained.
- h. At the end of term or course or part of syllabus, the last number to be taken as total attendance.
- i. The total attendance after students signature to be certified by respective HOD followed by approval by Principal.
- j. In case of multiple terms, at the end of course all term attendance is to be summarised and percentage is to be calculated separately for theory and practical including clinicals & non-lecture hours.

8. Organization of the Program:

- a. Each academic year is of 4 ½ years excluding the period of internship and each academic year will have at least 320 teaching days. Afterward, one-year compulsory rotatory Internship and shall mean integrated clinical duty per day.
- b. The BAMS program is divided in to FOUR phases —

9. Syllabi:

- The syllabi of the program shall contain subject wise content details as prescribed by National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) duly approved by Board of study and academic council shall be published separately and shall incorporate modifications/ changes as and when notified by NCISM.

10. Program Curriculum:

- There shall be a 15-day Transitional Curriculum Program which intends to introduce newly admitted student to Ayurveda system of medicine and to make student well aware of the B.A.M.S. Programme which he is going to study for next four and a half years.
- Total working days for each professional session shall be not less than three hundred and twenty days.
- First Professional:** Subjects covered - Samskritam evam Ayurved Ithihas (AyUG-SN & AI), Padartha Vigyan (AyUG-PV), Kriya Sharira (AyUG-KS), Rachana Sharira (AyUG-RS), Samhita Adhyayan-1(AyUG-SA1) and Electives (Minimum Three) subjects.
- Second Professional:** Subjects covered — Dravyaguna Vigyan (AyUG-DG), Rasashastra evam Bhaishajyakalpana (AyUG-RB), Roga Nidan evam Vikriti Vigyan (AyUG-RN), Agad Tantra evam Vidhi Vaidyaka (AyUG-AT), Samhita Adhyayan-2 (AyUG-SA2), Swasthavritta evam Yoga (AyUG-SW) and Elective (Minimum Three) Subjects

- **Third (Final) Professional:** Subjects covered — Kayachikitsa including Manasa Roga (AyUG-KC), Rasayana and Vajikarana, Panchakarma & Upakarma (AyUG-PK), Shalya Tantra (AyUG-ST), Shalakya Tantra (AyUG-SL), Prasuti Tantra evam Stree Roga (AyUG-PS), Kaumarabhritya (AyUG-KB), Samhita Adhyayan-3 (AyUG-SA2), Atyaikachikitsa (AyUG-EM), Research Methodology and Medical-statistics (AyUG-RM) and Elective (Minimum Three) Subjects

11. Evaluation Scheme:

Assessment. -

- Assessment of students shall be in the form of Formative and Summative Assessments as under-

a. Formative Assessment. -

Students shall be assessed periodically to assess their performance in the class, determine the understanding of programme material and their learning outcome in the following manner, namely: -

- Periodical Assessment shall be carried out at the end of teaching of a topic or module or a particular portion of syllabus and the evaluation methods.
- internal evaluation shall be conducted by the College and Institute at the end of six months (First Term Test) for thirty per cent. of the syllabus and at twelve months (Second Term Test) for forty per cent. new part of the syllabus.
 - The remaining thirty per cent. of syllabus shall be completed in the last six months (Third Term) before university examination.
- there shall be minimum three periodical assessments for each subject before First Term Test (ordinarily at 6th month of respective professional B.A.M.S.) minimum of three periodical assessment before Second Term Test (ordinarily at 12th month of respective professional B.A.M.S.) and minimum of three periodical assessments before final university examinations (Summative Assessment) of respective professional B.A.M.S.

- Maximum Marks in Parentheses

a. Summative Assessment. -

- Final university examinations conducted at the end of each professional B.A.M.S. shall be the Summative Assessment.
- There shall be double valuation system without any provision for revaluation. However, Scrutiny for verification of total marks (recounting) is permitted. Application for recounting must reach the controller of examination through proper channel within 10 days of declaration of result subject to payment of fee as decided by university authorities, from time to time.
- There shall be two examiners (one internal and one external) for university practical/clinical/viva voce examinations.

b. Evaluation of Electives. -

Electives shall be evaluated in terms of attendance and assessment and on the basis of evaluation, the student shall be awarded credits as well as grades as under-

- one credit shall be awarded for attending minimum five hours of a modular programme and a student can earn maximum five credits for each elective.
- Assessment shall be conducted at the end of each module and average of five modular assessments shall be considered for grading i.e., up to 25 per cent. Bronze; 26-50 percent. Silver; 51-75 per cent. Gold; 76 per cent. and above Platinum.
- The structure of elective shall be as per the following table, namely: -

- Student shall have to qualify (obtaining any grade) minimum of three elective subjects for each professional session.
- List of elective subjects shall be made available under three sets (A, B and C) for each professional session i.e., sets FA, FB and FC for first professional B.A.M.S.
- Student may opt any one elective as per their choice from each set specified for respective professional B.A.M.S.
- Weightage of two marks for each credit and maximum of ten marks shall be awarded for each elective.
- These elective marks shall be added to the viva-voce marks of respective subjects as specified in these regulations.
- Apart from three mandatory electives for each profession, students have freedom to choose and qualify as many numbers of additional electives as per their interest.
- Marks weightage shall be only for three electives per professional session i.e., one elective subject from each set of respective professional session.
- A separate online certificate shall be generated for each elective mentioning credits earned and grades obtained.
- The examination section/cell shall compile the marks of electives obtained by students as specified above and submit to university through the Head of the Institution so that the university shall add the same in viva-voce of respective subjects.

While declaring the results of Summative Assessment, Internal Assessment component and Elective marks shall be considered as per the distribution of marks pattern provided in Tables as follows.

- Theory: The question paper setting will be prepared according to subject wise objectives in line with guidelines and directives of NCISM.
- Practical —Lab / Clinical: shall take into account common diseases which the student is likely to come in contact in practice. Rare cases/obscure syndromes, long cases shall not be put for final examination.
- Viva/ oral: is to evaluate skill in interpretation of investigative data, x-rays, identification of specimens, ECG, etc. and approach /handling of emergencies.

12. Examinations:

a) Examination Schedule –

- a. 1st Professional examination at the end of 1st professional (On completion of 18 months including 15 days mandatory Transitional Curriculum and 3 Elective subjects)
 - b. 2nd Professional examination — At the end of 2nd professional academics (On completion of 18 Months and 3 Elective subjects)
 - c. 3rd Professional examination — At the end of 3rd professional academics (On completion of 18 months and 3 Elective subjects)
- b) In an academic year two university examinations shall be conducted, the main examination shall be held after the prescribed duration of 18 months (which will also include the examination period of each professional term) and the subsequent supplementary examination shall be held at every 06 months.

13. Qualifying Standards and eligibility:

- The minimum marks required for passing the examination shall be fifty per cent. In theory component and fifty percent in practical component (that include practical, clinical, viva-voce, internal assessment and electives wherever applicable) separately in each subject.

14. Promotional Rules:

- a. The minimum marks required for passing the examination shall be fifty per cent. In theory component and fifty percent in practical component (that include practical, clinical, viva-voce, internal assessment and electives wherever applicable) separately in each subject.
- b. the student who failed in one or two subjects of First Professional shall be allowed to keep terms of the Second Professional session and to appear in Second Professional examination.
- c. the student who failed in more than two subjects shall not be allowed to keep term in Second Professional session and the subsequent supplementary examination of First Professional shall be held at every six months.
- d. the student who failed in one or two subjects of Second Professional shall be allowed to keep the term of the Third (Final) Professional session.
- e. the student who failed in more than two subjects shall not be allowed to keep term in Third (Final) Professional session and the subsequent supplementary examinations of Second Professional shall be held every 6 months.
- f. Before appearing for Third (Final) Professional examination the students shall have to pass all the subjects of first and second professional and shall qualify nine electives.
- g. There shall be no separate class for odd batch student (those students who could not keep the term) and the student has to attend the class along with regular batch or with junior batch as applicable.



- h. To become eligible for joining the Compulsory Rotatory Internship programme, all three professional examinations shall be passed and qualified in nine electives within a period of maximum ten years from the date of admission.

15. Grace Marks:

- A student can be awarded 'Grace Marks' not exceeding a maximum 5 marks in theory component in a single subject in one professional session for passing an examination. However, the grace marks shall not be part of the grand total.

16. Results:

- a) The examination result of a student shall be declared separately for each examination which will indicate the status of his performance in the respective professional.
- b) Final result for declaring division and award of degree shall be prepared on the basis of cumulative performance of student in each professional.
- c) A student result of professional shall be updated based on outcome of his/ her appearing in an examination.

17. Award of Division:

- a. A candidate obtaining sixty-five per cent. and above marks shall be awarded first class in the subject and seventy five percent and above marks shall be awarded distinction in the subject.
- b. The award of class and distinction shall not be applicable for supplementary examinations.
- c. A student will be said to have Passed with Honors' if he/ she obtains 75% or more marks in final result, provided he/ she has passed all examinations in first attempt and without invoking any grace marks.

18. Merit List:

- The merit list to award the rank shall be prepared based on aggregate marks of final result. However, those students who have passed all examination in first attempt without invoking any grace marks shall be eligible for award of Rank.

19. Award of degree:

- The student shall be eligible for award of BAMS degree on successful completion of prescribed course of study and have been declared pass in final result.

20. Power to Amend the Ordinance

- The 'Academic Council' shall have the powers to relax, amend any or all the provisions of the Ordinances, subject to the approval of the 'Executive Council' of the University. However, amendment shall not be in contravention of guidelines and directives of NCISM and Ministry of Ayush.
