

Ordinance of Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing Effective from Session 2022-2023

1. SCOPE

- a) This ordinance shall apply to the program leading to Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing degree.
- b) The various clauses of this ordinance and syllabus of the program are subject to provisions and circulars notified by Board of studies of Indian Nursing Council.
- c) Any change/ revision/ modification as well resolution passed/ circular issued by the Indian Nursing Council, shall be incorporated as it is by the University in their compliance with immediate effect.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

- a) A candidate seeking admission to the Post Basic B. Sc. Nursing Program should have passed General Nursing and Midwifery from any institution recognized By Indian Nursing Council with minimum of 50% marks in aggregate.
- b) A candidate must have obtained minimum 55% aggregate marks in the qualifying examination.
- c) A candidate has to be a 'Registered Nurse and Registered Midwife' or equivalent with any State Nursing Registration Council.
- d) A candidate shall have to be medically fit.

3. ADMISSION

- a) Admission to the program shall be made once in a year.
- b) Admission to the program is open to both male and female candidates.
- c) Admission shall be made on merit basis or as approved by the Vice Chancellor.
- d) Last date for admission shall be as 31st October for the admission year.

4. PROGRAM DURATION

- a) The duration of the program leading to award degree of Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing shall be of two academic years.
- b) The maximum period for completion of program shall be for four academic years.

5. ANNUAL INTAKE

- a) The number of the students shall be admitted as approved by the executive council of the university subject to maximum seat sanctioned by the Indian Nursing Council.

6. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

- a) The medium of instruction, subject of study and examination shall be English.

7. ATTENDANCE

- a) Student is normally required to attend the lectures and practical of every subject as also the curricular and co-curricular activities.
- b) A student must have minimum 80% attendance in theory and practical of each





- a) A student's performance will be evaluated through annual examination held at the end of each academic session and continuous assessment of both theory and practical in the form of Class- Tests, assignments, participation in co-curricular activities etc.
- b) The distribution of marks for the subjects shall be as per the evaluation scheme.

11.EVALUATION SCHEME

- e) Average score of internal awards of theory or practical must not be more than 75%.
- d) A student not qualified in the theory and / or practical, shall be required to re-appear in both theory and practical examination.
- c) The practical examination/ dissertation evaluation will be conducted by the panel of examiners. The examiner panel will consist of the one external examiner and one internal examiner.
- b) A student shall be admitted to final year examination only after he/she has passed/cleared all the subject of first year.
- a) In all academic year, there shall be two university examinations. The main examination shall be held at the end of the academic year and the supplementary examination will be conducted within two months of declaration of main examination result.

**college examination (Not university examination)

Paper- Nursing Research and statistics shall have two sections A and B. Section A shall carry questions from Nursing Research shall bear 50 marks and section B shall carry the questions from Statistics shall bear 25 marks.

12. QUALIFYING STANDARDS

a) Minimum pass marks for each theory and practical subject shall be 50%. However, minimum pass marks for English subject shall be 33%.

b) A candidate has to score pass marks in internal and external examination individually

of each subject.

13. PROMOTIONAL RULES

a) A student satisfying the entire qualifying standard shall be declared pass in the academic year.

b) A student, if in conjunction of grace marks; satisfy all the qualifying standards in the academic year shall be declared as pass with grace marks.

c) A student failing to satisfy the qualifying standards of one or more subjects in the academic year shall be permitted to pursue course work of next academic year and

clear back papers in subsequent university examination.



19. POWER TO AMEND THE ORDINANCE

- a) The 'Academic Council' shall have the power to relax, amend any or all the provisions of the Ordinances, subject to the approval of the 'Executive Council' of the university. However amendment shall not be in contravention of guidelines and directives of Indian Nursing Council.
